Course Description:

This course is an introduction to the lives of key leaders of the Christian church, from the period of the late Middle Ages through to the present. This will involve a detailed study of the late Middle Ages, the Magisterial Reformation, the post-Reformation period (focus on Puritans), Evangelicalism, and twentieth-century evangelicalism.

Course Objectives:

After completing the course the student should be able to:

- 1. Understand the broad strokes of church history from the fourteenth century to the present
- 2. Know the figures involved in key events
- 3. Use primary source material related to the figures and events
- 4. Explicate the doctrines that are distinct to Reformed Protestantism
- 5. Write a research paper that demonstrates an understanding of the topic both in terms of its contemporary situation and recent research
- 6. Appreciate the providential hand of God who directs history and protects his church
- 7. Appropriate lessons learned from these Christians for his or her Christian life, cf. Heb. 13:7
